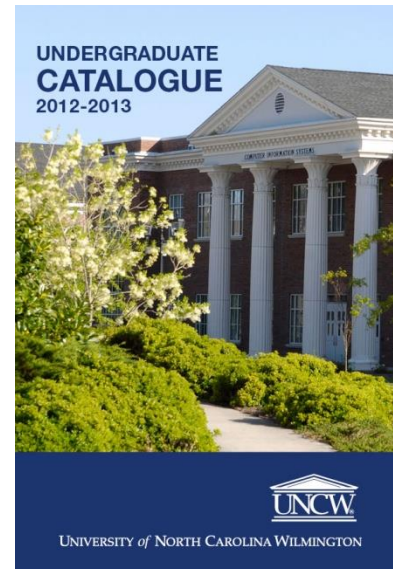

Credits: 3

Prerequisite: Formal enrollment in the Honors Scholars Program or consent of the director. An in-depth investigation of a special topic using the approaches of several disciplines; may be team-taught. Topics and approaches vary. Examples are "Brain and Behavior"; "The Geography of Food"; "Nature: Literature and Science"; "Issues in Coastal Management." May be repeated under different subtitles. ~~Partially Satisfies University Studies III: Thematic Transdisciplinary Cluster/Immigration.~~

CRM 300 - Methods of Social Research

Credits: 3

(SOC 300) Prerequisite: [SOC 105](#) or [CRM 105](#); pre or co-requisite: [MAT 111](#) or higher with a grade of "C-" or better. Introduction to logic and methods of sociological research. Topics include connections between theory and research, problem formulation and research design, conceptualization and

measurement, sampling modes of observation and analysis, ethical issues, and the political context of research. [Partially satisfies University Studies IV: Building Competencies/Information Literacy.](#)

BIO 458 - Fisheries Biology

Credits: 3

~~Prerequisite or corequisite: [BIO 357](#), [STT 215](#), or consent of instructor. Examination of the factors that control the population metrics such as age, growth, mortality, and abundance, population model construction using spreadsheets, and fishery management strategies. Three lecture and three laboratory hours each week. The lab for this course is [BIOL 458](#). (The description for this course was erroneously changed to an earlier version in the 2011-12 catalogue during the transition to the online catalogue format. Introduction to the principles of fisheries science including estimation of population metrics such as age, growth, mortality, and abundance, fish stock assessment, and fishery management strategies.
